

## Wacoan Robbed Of Jewels, Cash In His Own Home

A. A. Davis, 1619 Washington Avenue, Is Held Up as He Was Preparing for Bed

A hijacker, combining boldness with the threat of an automatic pistol, walked into the home of A. A. Davis, 1619 Washington avenue, at 10 o'clock Monday night and robbed Davis of a diamond ring valued at \$1000, a stud valued at \$300 and \$80 in cash.

### Looks Up to See Gunman

Resting in his room preparatory to retiring, the astonished Davis looked up to see a young man training a gun on him. "Give me that diamond," the bandit commanded, Davis told police.

Davis said he removed the ring and kept silent under the threat of the gun while the bandit strode over to a dresser and picked up the stud.

Then, Davis, said, the bandit searched his pockets and took the cash from his pocketbook.

### Others of Family Undisturbed

Davis was alone in the front room but other members of the family were in the house and knew nothing of the bold raid of the bandit until he had left hurriedly through the front door.

Radio Patrolmen R. M. Brownlow and Ed Emmons were at the house about five minutes after the robbery but no trace of the "tall slender young man" was found.

Police theorized that the bandit had probably seen the large diamond on Davis' finger and had followed him to his home or learned his identity.

Davis told the officers that he did not hear any car drive away from the vicinity after the bandit left.
