

## Sheriff's Deputy And a Cab Driver Each Shot in Arm

Alleged Marksman Who  
Wanted Cabby's Auto,  
and Then Resisted Ar-  
rest, Jailed

Tommy Campbell And  
R. M. Brownlow Hurt

Former, Driver of Taxi,  
Taken to Hospital by  
Man Whom He Says  
Wounded Him

A Wacoan was in jail Sunday pending a charge of assault to murder which Assistant District Attorney Francis Bauerle said would be filed against him Monday morning, following the shooting of Tommy Campbell, 1532 Herring avenue, taxi driver, and R. M. Brownlow, deputy sheriff. Neither of the men was seriously injured. Each was shot in the arm.

### Relate Fantastic Stories

Out of the fantastic affair Brownlow got a bullet which fell into his hand after going up his sleeve and slashing his arm; and Campbell had the experience of driving to hospital with the man he said shot him.

Campbell told officers he got a call from the alleged assailant around 11 p. m. Saturday. He drove to the house, stopped in front, and honked his horn. The man and a young woman came out, he said.

"Tommy, I'll have to use your car a while," he quotes his assailant as saying.

### Driver Saw Menacing Pistol

The driver saw the man had a pistol. The driver took the keys from the car, he said, and answered, "You may shoot me, but you can't have my car."

Then, he said, the assailant fired two shots at him with the pistol, a .32-calibre revolver. One shot struck him in the upper left arm.

Campbell went into the man's house, got a towel and tied up his arm, and drove his car to the Providence sanitarium, with the assailant.
