In the year 1781 I lived within one mile
of John Brownlow the deponent in the foregoing
affidavit I know well of Brownlow going out
in the expedition mentioned in his statement
for I was with him on Sunday before the
battle in which he was wounded, (at the camp)
I saw him on his return from the battle and
in the precise situation as to wounds as in
mentioned in his affidavit - I was his neighbor
until after his recovery and much of my
time with him, and often assisted in dressing
his wounds, and saw bones which came from
the wound in his head. - I was very intimately
acquainted with Brownlow both before and
after he received his wounds, and it is my
opinion and also that of many of his acquaintances
that his intellects were impaired by his wound
During my acquaintance with Brownlow he
was reported a very fair character.
